Charlotte Jones

Charlotte Jones' first play, *Airswimming*, was premièred at the Battersea Arts Centre, London and later broadcast on Radio 4. *In Flame* was premièred in January 1999 at the Bust Theatre, London and revived at the New Ambassadors, London in September 2000. *Martha, Josie and the Chinese Elvis* premièred at the Bolton Octagon in April 1999 and transferred to the Liverpool Everyman in May of that year. It won the *Manchester Evening News Best Play Award* and the *Pearson Television Best Play Award* of 1999. It was recently revived at the Watford Palace Theatre. Charlotte Jones won the *Critics' Circle Award for the Most Promising Playwright* in 2000 for *In Flame* and *Martha, Josie and the Chinese Elvis*. *Humble Boy* was awarded the *Susan Smith Blackburn Award*, 2001, the *Critics' Circle Best New Play Award*, 2002, and the *People's Choice Best New Play Award*, 2002.

The Royal National Theatre production of this play was recorded by the National Video Archive of Performance at the Theatre Museum.

The Buzz on Bees
